Civil Society Law Reform

Survey on Freedom of Association is Closed

Funded by the European Union's European Instrument for Democracy and Human Rights (EIDHR), the project called Preparation of Methodology for the Monitoring of Freedom of Association in Turkey Project was launched in January 2009. The project is implemented by TUSEV in partnership with the Civil Society Development Centre (STGM) and resulted in an online survey as a pilot methodology to capture the realities of freedom of association in Turkey. The first phase of the Survey on the Freedom of Association closed on December 7th, culminating the common concerns of different stakeholders regarding freedom of association in Turkey. 200 associations from 40 cities participated in the survey which covered issues such as registration procedures, initiation of members, documentation, general assembly, auditing, international relations, membership, fines, taxes and activities related to the Press Law, Meeting and Demonstration Law and Aid Collection Law. An executive summary on the outcomes of the survey will be published soon and the online survey will re-launch in mid-2010. TUSEV would like to thank all survey respondents for their participation.

US Foundations Transparency Portal is launched

Foundation Center announced the launch of a new web portal called Glasspockets which is designed to inspire greater openness among private foundations. At www.glasspockets.org, foundations that have taken the lead in communicating about their work, particularly using online resources and social networks, are featured along with direct links to their current initiatives. Glasspockets encourages these organizations to tell the stories of their successes — and failures — in part by highlighting exemplary efforts of their peers. Ağrı İbrahim Cecen University Opened its Doors

The opening ceremony of the Faculty of Science and Literature and Rectorate Buildings of the Ağrı İbrahim Çeçen University was held on 21 October 2009 with the participation of Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdoğan. Founded in Ağrı (a small city on the eastern boundary of Turkey) by philanthropist İbrahim Çeçen, the university started academic functioning with almost 3,200 students. The construction of the campus which is to be donated to the Turkish government is still underway. 60 million dollars will be allocated for the construction in the campus which will serve 20,000 students by 2015. Ibrahim Cecen Foundation develops programmes in order to contribute to the social and cultural development of the University which presents great potential for the social and economic development of Ağrı, the poorest city in Turkey by GDP per capita.
