











TUSEV General Assembly 2015

TUSEV's General Assembly was held on April 18, 2015 with the participation of member foundations and associations. Meeting was hosted by the Turkish Educational Foundations Advisory Council (TEVDAK), in Kabatas High School, Hamdi Saver Conference Room. Members were informed about the activities and financial status of TUSEV in 2014, the estimated budget and the work plan for 2015 were approved by the Board of Trustees.



Ways of Non-financial Gains for CSOs in the Balkans and Turkey

Balkan Civil Society Development Network (BCSDN) has published Ways of Non-financial Gains for CSOs in the Balkans and Turkey policy brief with the support of the Open Society Foundations Think Tank Fund. The Policy Brief presents the findings from the Monitoring Matrix country reports and in a comparative perspective reviews the legal frameworks regulating the distribution of non-financial support available for civil society organizations in the Western Balkans and Turkey. TUSEV contributed in the publication by providing an overview of the current state in Turkey.



TUSEV Members Gather Together

Starting with 2015, TUSEV plans to organize series of thematic meetings to enable information and experience sharing between its members. First of these meetings was held on March 11, 2015 with the participation of TUSEV members providing scholarships for educational purposes. 25 representatives from 23 member organizations discussed the scholarship system in Turkey and expressed their views on possible ways of collaboration.



Emerging Leaders in Philanthropy 2015 Program

TUSEV organizes the Emerging Leaders in Philanthropy Program with an aim to enhance the human resources capacity and engage organizations and civil society professionals in philanthropic initiatives. Following a successful program in 2014, the 2015 period began in January with 12 participants from a variety of backgrounds and CSOs focusing on different causes. The program takes place once a month for six months period and covers an area of philanthropic development at each module, by way of presentations from the field experts, workshops, discussions and readings.

During the first year of the project, 60 teachers from 10 pilot schools in Istanbul will receive training on the Orff approach to musical education. The project will then provide their schools with the Orff instruments needed to implement this educational method.
