The Impact of COVID-19 Outbreak on Civil Society Organizations Operating in Turkey Survey II Report is Published

TUSEV published the second report of the Impact of COVID-19 Outbreak on Civil Society Organizations Operating in Turkey Survey in October 2020. The survey was conducted to monitor the state of civil society organizations and better understand their changing needs during the pandemic. The second phase of the survey consisted of 39 questions under six topics (General Questions, Current Resources, Impact of COVID-19 on Your Organization, Grants and Funds, Aids and Donations and Employment and Sustainability), which were answered by 141 CSO representatives, between August 11 and 19, 2020. virtual peer learning event for Global Alliance members, which took place between 12-22 January 2021. The forum covered a wide range of topics including cross-border giving, COVID-19, crises and disaster funding, the future of philanthropy and digital change and creating & strengthening partnerships. TUSEV also contributed to the forum with a presentation focusing on the recent changes effecting civil society in Turkey in building voice, visibility and influence session.



Project TUSEV contributed to Philanthropy Advocacy, a joint project by the

European Foundation Center (EFC) and Dafne, which also provides insights into the legal and fiscal landscape of philanthropy across Europe. Prepared and updated within the project, the 40 country profiles contain information such as requirements for registration, reporting, economic activity, and governance, tax treatment as well as trends and developments related to foundations. 


America (CAF America) published the Future-Proofing Nonprofits for the Post-Pandemic World, the sixth
